CAMPING DU LAC Depiction of the slaughter of a chicken.

CHUCK CHUCK BABY addresses misogynistic physical and psychological violence, deprivation of liberty.

DRAW FOR CHANGE: WIR SIND FEUER addresses femicides and sexualised violence.

ELLBOGEN contains depictions of strong physical violence and offensive behaviour.

FAMILY TIME contains depictions of alcohol abuse.

HELLBENDER is a horror film and, in keeping with the genre, contains depictions of violence.

MAMBAR PIERETTE contains depictions of physical violence.

PERPETRATOR is a horror film and, in keeping with the genre, contains depictions of violence.

PREVENGE is a horror film and, in keeping with the genre, contains depictions of violence.

REAS addresses different experiences of physical and psychological violence.

SHORT FILM PROGRAMME: SO, WHAT'S THE OUTLOOK LIKE? addresses different forms of violence, including ableist violence and police violence.

TIGER STRIPES contains depictions of violence in keeping with the genre, including violence against animals.

WOLFSBAUDE contains language that is discriminatory against Sinti and Roma.
